

## **Louis B. Bergerson**

(Note: sometimes spelled Bergersen)

Dr. Louis Barndt Bergerson was born on May 5, 1893 in West St. Paul, MN. His parents were Andrew N. Bergerson and Georgian Bergerson. He had two brothers and one sister. Prior to his military service, Bergerson worked as a dentist but was unemployed at the time of his draft registration.

Bergerson joined the colors in July of 1917. Bergerson served in the Medical Detachment of the 315th Ammunition Train in France. His rank was Captain DC. He departed Brest, France aboard the S.S. Maui on June 2, 1919. Bergerson was mustered out of the service on September 2, 1919.

After the war, Bergerson married Millie (maiden name unknown). In 1930, Louis, Millie, and their 3 year old son Dean were living in Dawson, MN. He was working as a general practice dentist. In 1942, he was still working as a dentist, at his own practice in West St. Paul. Bergerson died on February 7, 1974 and was buried at Fort Snelling National Cemetery.
